POLICY: The Shawnee County Community Developmental Disability Organization (CDDO) may impose consequences to any Targeted Case Manager/Targeted Case Management provider that fails to meet the requirements set forth in regulations, State of Kansas/CDDO contracts, State of Kansas/CDDO policies/procedures and the CDDO/Community Service Provider Affiliate Agreement.

GUIDELINES:

- 1. TCM affiliates will cooperate with the TCM Review process.
- 2. Upon receipt of issues, concerns, or complaints regarding Targeted Case Management (TCM) services the Shawnee County CDDO Quality Management Coordinator (QMC)will follow-up with the provider.
- 3. The Shawnee County CDDO QMC in collaboration with Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) will request a written Corrective Action Plan (CAP) from the provider whenever a deficiency is identified. The plan will indicate the dates for implementation, not exceeding thirty (30) days, and proactive actions to ensure the deficiency is not repeated. The provider may be placed on non-referral status at the CDDO's discretion.
- 4. Once the CDDO has approved the submitted CAP the CDDO Quality Management Coordinator will monitor the provider to ensure adherence of the CAP.
- 5. If the identified deficiency has not been corrected, the Shawnee County CDDO QMC team will notify the provider in writing at the end of thirty (30) days as to whether they are on probationary status.
- 6. During the probationary period, the provider will be reflected as not accepting referrals on the TCM referral list.
- 7. When the specified probation has ended, the Shawnee County CDDO in collaboration with the KDADS staff will decide, based on the corrective actions of the provider to:
 - a) Provide notification in writing that they have corrected the identified deficiency, at which time the
 probationary period will end. The provider's name will be reflected as accepting referrals on the TCM
 referral list.
 - b) Provide notification in writing the probationary period has been extended, not exceeding ninety (90) days, so that the full impact of the corrective action may be reviewed.
 - c) The Shawnee County CDDO will provide written notification to terminate Affiliate Agreement for TCM Services.
- 8. TCM Providers can access the Shawnee County CDDO Dispute Resolution Policy 06-020.
