### CDDO Updates:

- Introduction of new CDDO Assessor, Angie Dougan. Angie has recently began scheduling assessments for A-G individuals.
- The new Person Centered Service Plan policy can be found on the KDADS website. Please note: within the Policy, there is reference to a “Person Centered Support Plan” template. A version of the Person Centered Support Plan template was located on the KDADS website by using the websites “search” function (see attached). However, there has been no guidance from KDADS in regard to the template, and no indication if it is the finalized version.

- BCI passwords – password changes are done yearly. You now have the capability of changing your own password. Password requirements – they must be eight characters long and include upper case, lower case, number and special character. ### Guest Speaker(s):

- Krista Hahn, Executive Director, Marian Dental Clinic
  - The Marion Dental Clinic now has three full-time dentists, 15 paid staff and 35 volunteer staff
  - The clinic continues to work toward giving a positive experience and to treat individuals more comprehensibly so they come for routine check-ups rather than emergencies.
  - Services have expanded to offer Dentistry for Diabetics including chair-side A1C testing and diet and nutrition education.
  - The clinic works with individuals to assist in overcoming barriers that could keep them from seeking the dental care needed.
  - They accept private insurance, public insurance and offer a sliding scale fee. This is to assist individuals who have insurance but cannot afford their co-pays or deductibles.
  - Staff members are currently being trained for sedation dentistry.

- It was asked if they offer practice visits for individuals that high anxiety or other issues with going to the dentist. They do offer Happy Visits to assist the individual acclimated to be at the dentist office. If this is needed contact Krista.
  - The have partnered with Stormont Vail and The University of Kansas Health System St. Francis Campus for their ER to Chair program. This service is for individuals that have gone to the ER for dental issues. The hospital refers the patient to the clinic and are seen that day or the next day for dental care.
  - Walk-in emergencies vary between 5-15 patients a day most are treated the same day.



## ACCESSIBILITY PROGRAM



The Accessibility Program provides modifications to residential homes for individuals with physical disabilities who are either homeowners or renters. The Assistance is provided to gain:

One access to the home  
 Exterior ramp  
 Modifications to the bathroom  
 Access to one bathroom and/or bedroom

To be eligible for this program the applicant must:

Fill out an Application  
 Provide documentation – verify physical disability  
 Own and/or Occupy the property (for bathroom modifications)  
 Provide proof of income less than 80% median income  
 Inspection

### 2017 - Income limits by household size:




The assistance is provided as a one-time grant and not repaid. Individuals with verified physical disabilities whose primary residence is within the city limits of Topeka, Kansas and the residence may be either homeowner-occupied or renter-occupied.

## EMERGENCY REPAIR PROGRAM





The Emergency Repair Program is intended to help homeowners make repairs to immediate health or safety problems such as the following:

- Furnace Replacement
- Sewer Line Collapse
- Water Heater Replacement
- Significant water line, waste line, or gas line leakage
- Medically required and documented mechanical systems
- Roof Replacement (not repair)

To initially be eligible for this program the applicant must:

- Fill out an Application
- Own and occupy the property for 1 year in City
- Provide proof of income less than 60% median income
- Provide government photo identification



The first \$1,500 of assistance is a grant and not repaid. Home repair assistance greater than \$1,500.00 requires a mortgage to be filed between the City and homeowner through a Deferred Loan.

The Deferred Loan Program requires no monthly payments or interest on the loan. The loan does not have to be paid back until the house is sold or the applicant ceases to live in the house. During the first seven years of the loan 50% of the original repair cost is forgiven provided the applicant has resided in the property during that time. After the seventh year the remaining 50% of the loan is a permanent mortgage on the property and is only paid back when the house is sold, refinanced or transferred.

***Dentistry for Diabetics is a program designed to foster healthy lifestyles for diabetic patients through comprehensive dental care, chairside diabetic monitoring, and oral health education.***

### ***What is the need?***

Uncontrolled diabetes affects the whole body and directly impacts an individual's lifestyle. In 2014, KDHE found that 1 out of every 10 Kansas adults reported having been diagnosed with diabetes. The American Dental Association has found that 1 in 5 cases of tooth loss are linked to diabetes. Poor blood sugar levels and uncontrolled diabetes increase the risk of oral infection. There is a systemic link to this chronic disease that makes a healthy lifestyle especially difficult to achieve. Uncontrolled diabetes can increase the risk of heart disease, increase the risk of lower extremity amputations, and is the leading cause of blindness in working adults ([www.KansasHealthMatters.org](http://www.KansasHealthMatters.org), Shawnee County Data-2014). With diabetes come many oral manifestations, such as, dry mouth, gum tissue inflammation, delayed wound healing, and an increased susceptibility to oral infections; which all can lead to dental abscesses, gum disease, and/or tooth loss. Dental health is just one factor in a healthy lifestyle, but is one of the most important factors.

### ***How do we plan to meet the need?***

The Dentistry for Diabetics program will provide diabetic patients:

- A direct link to comprehensive dental care preventing tooth loss and periodontal disease.
- Diabetes-focused oral health education to help create behavior change
- Basic diabetic monitoring to help patients begin to control their diabetes; including blood glucose monitoring at every dental appointment
- Direct referral to/from partnering health professionals and diabetic educators

In addition, the Dentistry for Diabetics program will give dental staff an opportunity to expand their knowledge of diabetes and behavior change; something dental training does not emphasize in depth. Educational material will be provided to local health care professionals, organizations, and education centers.



## CIVITAN DAY CAMP

Civitan is designed for young people with developmental, cognitive, and behavioral disabilities ages 8-17 or up to 21 if enrolled in high school next fall. Campers spend a large part of the day outdoors and need to be able to travel throughout the park at a group pace.

Dates: June 4, 2018 to August 3, 2018. No camp the weeks of May 29 - June 1 and July 2-6. Camp runs for 8 weeks, each week has a theme.


